District Attorney Hoovler Announces DA's Office Will Participate In 2017 National Night Out Against Crime

District Attorney and ADAs to Participate at Seven Orange County Events

Orange County District Attorney David M. Hoovler announced that on Tuesday, August 1, 2017, he and members of his staff will appear at the seven National Night Out Against Crime events being held in Orange County, as part of the District Attorney's community prosecution initiative. Hoovler will personally appear at many of the venues.

At each of the seven locations, the District Attorney's Office will have a table staffed by two Assistant District Attorneys that will display literature publicizing District Attorney Hoovler's community prosecution program. The staff will also offer free items designed to provide the public with information that might be valuable in crime prevention. This is the fourth year that District Attorney Hoovler will appear at National Night Out venues in the County. Events will be held in the Village of Greenwood Lake, the Village of Highland Falls, the City of Middletown, the City of Newburgh, the City of Port Jervis, the Village of Walden, and the Town of Wallkill.

"Communication between my office and the public is the key to crime prevention in this County," said District Attorney Hoovler, "and that philosophy is the driving force behind my community prosecution initiative. My staff and I have reached out to hundreds of community leaders and agencies, and appeared at hundreds of public events, all in an effort to communicate with the public in order to identify the issues that lead to crime in our communities, and in order to come up with solutions to those issues, so that we might prevent crime in the first place. Our participation in National Night Out is just one small part of our community prosecution efforts, that I hope will help us bring to the public the means to help us identify the issues that lead to crime, and the mechanisms to prevent it."
